

SECTION 10. EMERGENCY PARKING BAN

The Chief of Police shall have the authority to declare an “Emergency Parking Ban” prior to, during and after a weather event or storm or in the event of an emergency condition requiring such a ban. Upon doing so and in an effort to provide notice to vehicle owners, the Chief of Police will issue information concerned with the “Emergency Parking Ban” to local media, social media sites and via the Milford Police Department emergency notification system.

No person shall allow, permit or suffer any vehicle, other than one acting in an emergency, or vehicles registered as emergency vehicles to be parked on any street or highway during a declared “Emergency Parking Ban”.

If a vehicle is found in violation, it shall be prima facie evidence that the person to whom the vehicle is registered or titled is the person who allowed, permitted or suffered said vehicle to be so parked.

The Chief of Police or any officer may issue a parking violation ticket or notice stating the fine for the violation as provided for in Article IX. In addition to any other penalty provided by law, the Chief of Police or any officer may remove said vehicle from the street or highway by ordering that the vehicle be towed to a convenient location. The person to whom the vehicle is registered or titled shall be liable for the charges for the removal, towing and storage of the vehicle.

The Chief of Police is authorized to issue a parking permit allowing for the placement or parking of a vehicle on any street during an “Emergency Parking Ban”, provided that the Chief determines that the vehicle is registered as an emergency vehicle or that the vehicle is registered to or being utilized by a home health care worker or medical personnel or services providing in-home care or services to a disabled or handicapped person.
